TrumpRx Adds More Than 600 Generic Drugs, Announces Partnerships

The Trump administration recently [announced an expansion of its TrumpRx platform](#), adding more than 600 generic medications and deepening partnerships with several large pharmacy providers.

The announcement highlights newly formed partnerships with Amazon Pharmacy, GoodRx and Cost Plus Drugs, founded by Mark Cuban. According to the announcement, the expansion allows patients to compare the best cash prices available to them at their local pharmacies and through delivery options offered by these platforms.

The update marks a notable expansion for TrumpRx, a federal price-comparison website that launched in February 2026 with just a few dozen brand-name drugs.

At its core, TrumpRx is not an online pharmacy. Instead, it acts as a hub where consumers can compare cash prices for medications and find discounts from various companies. Users can search for a drug and then be directed to participating pharmacies or manufacturers to complete a purchase. For some medications, users can access a discount card right from the website to bring to a retail or online pharmacy.

What's New

The most significant update is the addition of more than 600 generic drugs, including widely used medications for conditions such as high blood pressure, diabetes and high cholesterol. When the website launched, it focused on specialty drugs and treatments like GLP-1s and fertility treatments.

The site also introduces tools designed to help users shop more effectively. Patients can now compare prices across local pharmacies or choose delivery options, making it easier to find the lowest available price. Many of these medications are priced very low, some under \$5, making them accessible to patients paying out of pocket.

According to the White House, the goal is to make prescription drug pricing more transparent and give consumers the ability to compare prices without relying solely on insurance companies.

A key part of the initiative is collaboration with private-sector companies. These partnerships allow TrumpRx to function as an aggregator, pulling together pricing data and directing users to the most affordable option. For example, many of the listed generic drugs may be fulfilled through Cost Plus Drugs, which specializes in low-cost, direct-to-consumer prescriptions.

For More Information

The expansion comes at a time when healthcare costs remain a major concern for many Americans. With generic medications accounting for roughly 90% of prescriptions, the platform is shifting toward frequently used medications for everyday consumers.

Most Americans have health insurance and likely won't need to use TrumpRx, as this platform operates outside of standard health insurance and copayments don't count toward reaching a deductible. However, this platform allows patients to compare prices. Still, the scale of the update is notable. Going from fewer than 100 drugs to more than 600 marks a dramatic change in scope and signals an evolving strategy to make TrumpRx more relevant to the average patient.
